

# 'Hot Dog Bill' Is Introduced

WASHINGTON

Observerland's three U.S. representatives were among a bi-partisan group of Michigan congressmen to introduce legislation which would permit Michigan to retain its high standards governing the ingredients in hot dogs, sausages and lunchmeats.

U.S. Reps. William Ford (D-Taylor), Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) and Martha Griffiths (D-Detroit) co-sponsored the legislation.

Ford said the action followed a recent ruling by the U.S. Sixth District Court of Appeals which would require Michigan to lower its standards to conform with less stringent federal regulations.

FEDERAL RULES permit use of virtually all animal parts including tongues, lips, ears, udders, snouts, bladders, hearts and glands. Michigan law only allows use of

"skeletal meat" which is primarily muscle.

Both Esch and Ford emphasized that the action didn't imply that the court made an incorrect interpretation of federal law.

"We simply want to clarify the situation so that similar problems will not arise in the future," they said.
