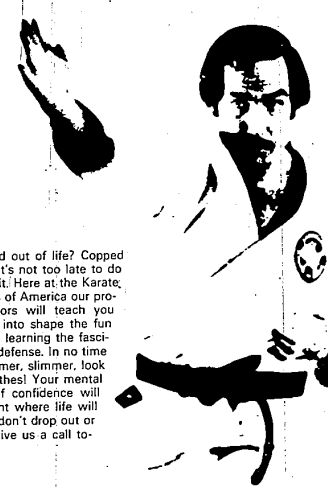
Mrs. Andrews Gets Position

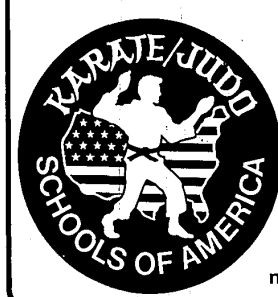

4 County Board Units Set Up
