TEUTONS MASSTO DRIVE OUT RUSS

Germans Attempt to Halt March
of Koenigsberg.

NEW INVASION IN HUNGARY

Fresh Troops of Czar Enter Joseph's Country Through Dukla Pass After Turning Austro-German Left Wing—Petrograd Reports Progress in East Prussia—New German Troops Lost.

Strongly re-enforced, the Germans in East Prussia are concentrating their efforts to halt the march in Koenigsberg by smashing at the Russian center, east of Pilskalen. Desperate fighting is in progress in the forests of the Pilskalen region. The Kaiser's new troops have been hurled into action near Ypres and have been thrown back with severe losses. Bayonet attacks unnerved the new regiments and they retreated in disorder, according to French official dispatches. German trenches have been destroyed by French artillery at several points.

ROME — An uncensored dispatch from Budapest says that a new Russian army has invaded Hungary. The new army entered Hungary through the Dukla pass, after turning the left wing of the Austro-German forces massed to the northward of the eastern Carpathians. The dispatch states unreservedly that the Russians are advancing unopposed at this point.

RUSS ADVANCE IN EAST PRUSSIA. PETROGRAD — A communication issued by the general staff reports some further progress in East Prussia and desperate fighting on the left bank of the Vistula. In the region around Borjnow the Russians have recaptured a trench lost to the Germans on the preceding day and declare that counter attacks of the Germans were repulsed everywhere except in one of the Russian saps which the Germans captured. The statement follows:

"In the forest to the North of Gumbinnen and Pilskalen our troops, continuing the conflict, have made progress at some points.

Trench is Recaptured. "On the left bank of the Vistula on Jan. 30 a desperate combat was under way. In the region of Borjnow the Germans, who had captured one of our trenches on the preceding day, were attacked by us after nightfall.

After an extremely tenacious struggle we succeeded, with the aid of a bayonet charge, in dislodging the enemy from the trench. We almost annihilated two entire companies of Germans, captured three officers and sixty soldiers and also took a rapid firing gun.

Four Regiments Used. "In the course of the day the enemy made a new attempt to drive us from our advanced trenches, but was everywhere repulsed after a bloody struggle, except in one of our saps where some elements of the enemy succeeded in establishing themselves.

"An examination of prisoners disclosed the fact that the Germans in their attack of the 28th upon a part of our regiments at Borjnow had employed four regiments of infantry, some of which were composed of seasoned men."

Turks Take Big Loot in Persia. PETROGRAD — A dispatch from Tephahan, the old capital of Persia, 200 miles from Teheran, says the Turks have raided the Eshah sanctuaries in Kerbela and seized \$10,000,000 in money and jewels. The Shiites are engaged over the destruction.

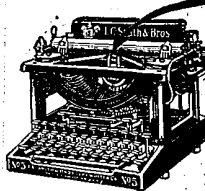
TROOPS CURB ROME RIOTS

War, Enthusiasts Attack Neutrals With Cries of "Shame."

ROME — Troops with fixed bayonets had to be called out to re-establish order at a meeting which had been organized by senators, members of the chamber of deputies, and other prominent persons with the purpose of forwarding a movement in movement in favor of Italy maintaining neutrality in the war. A larger number of persons, mostly Republicans, who are against the maintenance of neutrality, gathered at the entrance to the hall and, in spite of the efforts of the police, attacked the neutrals.

Deputy Bruno Belmonte, leader of the neutrals, had his ears boxed and some one spat in his face. He defended himself with his cane. During the disorder, cries of "Shame, Prince von Buelow has bought you, you anti-neutrals!" rose from the supporters of Austria.

Embargo Bill Passed Up. WASHINGTON — A report of Secretary of State Bryan's declaration that American interference with the shipment of contraband to the belligerent powers would be a breach of neutrality there will be no action by congress upon the pending bill to place an embargo on the exportation of arms and munitions of war.

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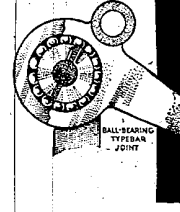
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
