Time on Board Ship.
Time in the navy is marked not by Time in the navy is marked not by hours, but by bells, just as in the merchant marine. The system of marking time by bells is very easy to understand once it is explained. Every four hours, 4, 8 and 12 o'clock, the ship's bell is struck eight times. At the end bell is struck eight times. At the end of the first half hour after each four hour period the bell is struck once, an hour afterward twice, and so on till the four hours are up, after which the preceding routine is begun over again.
