The ladies are planning to hold a fair some time early in November, for which they are already laying plans, and they invite the co operation and assistance of all in helping to make the affair a success.

Nearly all of the pupils of the music class of Miss Irene T. Kremer who appeared in the annual recital last week took part in a repetition of the recital at the David Prindle home Tuesday afternoon. Mrs. Prindle having been unable to attend owing to illness, and the second recital being given complimentary to her.

Herman Crenkuch was in Farmington Tuesday, and contracted for necessary material for the construction of a huge dancing pavilion which will be constructed in the grove at Walled Lake. The work is to be started at once and rushed to completion, and it is planned to have regular weekly dancing events. The pavilion will also be available for various social events.

The D. U. R. moved into and is now occupying its new waiting room at the corner of Bates and Jefferson streets, Detroit. Cars leave the Bates street entrance at the same time as they formerly left the Griswold street entrance of the old waiting room, and are now routed on Bates to Congress and on Congress across to Griswold. The new waiting room is a model one, and a great convenience. Many new and pleasing features have been installed in the new location.

A Visit to Stony Brook Dairy

The Ladies Union, together with a large number of visitors, spent a delightful afternoon, Thursday, at Stony Brook Farm.

The meeting was called to order and the business of the day rapidly transacted, the chief item being the subscription of another \$25.00 to carry on the church park work. Adjournment followed promptly to allow the ladies to enjoy a demonstration of the milk plant recently installed at Stony Brook.

According to promise, Mr. Johnson was in waiting at the dairy building, which is of concrete throughout; is cool light and airy. In the first compartment, the boiler, furnishing the hot water and steam, is seen on the right; on the left is the gasoline engine connected by shafting with the machinery in the second compartment. Here is the cream separator; the force pump which fills the large metal water tank in the top of the building; the cooling and bottling machine and the cleansing and sterilizing apparatus. The cooler and bottler consists of an upper and lower trough which cold water is continually passing. The milk is poured into the upper tank, passes over the coils and is received in the tank below, from where it passes through spouts directly into the bottles.

The cleansing apparatus consists of a deep metal sink supplied with hot and cold water in which is dissolved an antiseptic cleansing powder; the bottles filled with the solution are forced onto a rapidly revolving brush connected with the sink, where they are literally scourged; they then go to the sterilizing chamber where they are baked with superheated steam. All pails, cans and even the crates are steam sterilized. A large tank of ice water furnishes additional facilities for cooling purposes and this is to be supplemented by a built-in refrigerator, when the building is fully completed.
