DON'T CROWD ORCHARD TREES

Where Planted Too Close Together Cultivation is Prevented and Spraying Made Difficult.

Misinformation is given in certain sections concerning the proper distance between trees in an orchard. It has been enomeneded by certain uninformation enverymen that trees be planted about 15 feet apart each way, whereas they should be 35 to 40 feet apart.

The horticultural department of the Nebraska Agricultural college says that the proper distances for the different trees are as follows: Cherries and peaches, 20 feet; and apples, 30 to 40 feet except Whitney crab and duchess and other upright varieties, which may be planted but 25 feet apart.
