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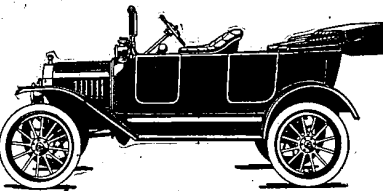

## Be a Booster

Do you know there's lots of people sittin' round in every town, Growlin' like a bloody chicken, Knockin' every good thing down? Don't you be that kind of grouch. 'Cause there ain't no use on earth, You just be a booster rooster—Crow and boost for all your worth. If your town needs boostin' boost 'er. Don't hang back and wait to see if some other fellow's willing'—Sail right in, this country's free. No one has a mortgage on it; It's just yours as much as his. If your town's shy on boosters, You get in the boostin' "biz." If things don't seem just to suit you, And the world seems kinder wrong, What's the matter with your boostin' Just to help the thing along? 'Cause if things should stop a-goin', We'd be in a sorry plight, Just you keep that horn blowin'—Boost her up with all your might. If you know some fellow's fallin', Just forget 'em, 'cause you know That same fellow has some good points—Them's the ones you want to show. 'Cast your loaves out on the waters, They'll come back,' a saying true, Mebbe, too, they'll come back better, When some fellow boosts for you.

The Ford peace ship got there without being a piece ship, although there has been several separations of the "peace party."

There are sixty persons in the United States who have a million dollar income. And they probably lie awake nights worrying over the 6 per cent tax they will have to pay.

Neutrality is pretty well preserved in the United States so far as naming postoffices is concerned. We have 25 Berlins, 13 Parises, 16 Viennas, 10 Londons, three Tokyos two Brussels and two St. Petersburgs—though not a single Constantinople.

Congressman Patrick H. Kelly has given his endorsement of Wm. Alden Smith as candidate for the nomination for president at the coming presidential primary, and in an address in Washington last week said he believed Michigan would play a most important part in the next national Republican convention.

Somehow the honor of holding a township office looks good to the average man—that is along about election time in the spring. But there is one office that has lost all charm for many of us and that is township treasurer. Its all very well the fore part of the term, but at tax time when nearly every man comes in with the idea that his taxes are too high and has half a notion to thrash the collector the office ceases to have any charm. It's bad enough to run a newspaper, but deliver us from the job of tax collector.

Last fall Prosecuting Attorney Doty informed the druggists of Oakland county that they could not sell liquor on prescription, and in no way whatever, except as compounded with other ingredients which would make it unfit for a beverage, after January 1, 1916. The druggists contended that, as long as they paid a government license of \$25 yearly, they could sell liquor on prescription. Mr. Doty, since has found that the opinion was overruled by the department of justice at Washington, which holds that "although whiskey, brandy and alcohol have been removed from the lists of medicines from the National Pharmacopoeia board, such ruling has not been adopted by the department of justice and therefore will not affect the old federal law. You are therefore allowed to proceed after January 1, 1916, with the sale of alcohol, whiskey and brandy as medicines only, and in strict compliance with the state law."
