 A man came to us a few days ago and asked us what there was to the "howl of the newspapers about the cost of paper?" We soon convinced him that there was a "great deal to it." Only a few days ago we received notice that the price of the paper the Enterprise is printed on each week would be advanced to almost double what it ever has been before. The ink used has more than doubled in price during the past two years, and in fact, everything that goes into the making of a newspaper has doubled, and in some cases tripled—everything except subscriptions, and unless the unforeseen happens it may be necessary for all papers to advance their subscription to \$1.50 per year or go out of business.

The Enterprise, however, is still sticking to the dollar—at least until the beginning of the new year. In the meantime it will be a good time to renew your subscription, as should we be compelled to raise the price, you would be paid for a year.
