

Village To Honor Guests

DEARBORN
Greenfield Village will take time out from the activities of the 23rd annual Old Car Festival Sept. 8 and 9 to honor special guests.

On Sept. 8 the village will pay tribute to Gordon Buehler, who is known for designing the classic Cord 810 and 812 models of the mid-1930s. He also designed the Auburn and Duesenberg boat-tails of the same period. More recently, Buehler was body engineer for the near-classic Continental Mark Two.

On Sept. 9, the village will honor four historical automobile societies for their preservation and dissemination of automotive history and their

restorations of antique automobiles.
They are the Antique Automobile Club of America, the Historical Automobile Society of Canada, the Horseless Carriage Club of America and the Veteran Motor Club of America.

Each day's activities begin at noon with a parade of antique cars through the village streets to the activities area. There they will compete for blue ribbons for the ex-

cellence and accuracy of their restoration and vie for prizes in a series of races and contests.

Among the highlights of the festival is a demonstration by the 60-member Wheelman Club, a national organization devoted to keeping alive the heritage of

American cycling and the techniques of riding antique high wheel bicycles.
Another is the Canadian Model T Assembly Team, which converts a weller of component parts into an operating car in a matter of minutes and drives it off the field.
Helping to recreate the nostalgia of America's early motoring days are appropriately costumed hostesses, and authentic Dixieland band and related special exhibits and crafts demonstrations.
