## amusement Music Director Quits Orchestra

Charles Heard, Westland's "music man" for nearly two years, is resigning as director of the civic symphony orchestra.

Heard, director of the orchestra since it was formed in the fall of 1971, is quitting the position because of the press of other musical responsibilities.

The director is head of the Rackham Choir, which accompanies the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in concerts, and is vocal music director at Wayne Memorial High School in the Wayne-Westland school district.

The resignation, disclosed by Mayor Eugene McKinney, will delay the start of tryouts for the 1973-74 orchestra season which was originally set for this month.

The orchestra's first concert will be in early December as part of the Christmas lighting ceremony at Westland city hall.

McKinney said that interested and qualified persons may apply for the director's job by contacting his office or the recreation department.

McKinney said he was sorry to see Heard leave, commenting that he "did a fantastic job from scratch" in

organizing the orchestra two years ago.

The mayor said that orchestra tryouts will be held after a new director is picked.
