

Transit Competition Initiated

The Michigan Public Transportation Council has invited cities to participate in a "New Transit" project by submitting a proposal for an efficient transit program.

The council has allocated \$400,000 for the preliminary design and engineering of the proposal which best utilizes new technology to move people through congested urban areas.

The council has suggested that cities, local or regional transportation agencies team up with private firms which have mass transit expertise in developing their proposal.

The council said it will consider several things in selecting the project, including evidence of broad-based support for the project, and demonstration that the proposed people-mover can be integrated with the local transportation system.

Other considerations include good probability that the new system will attract a higher than average volume of passengers; evidence that it will have a desirable impact on areas such as land use, environment and life styles of local citizens; and submission of plans for a project which is functional and attractive.
