

# Estate Seminar Is Scheduled

Plans are being finalized for a seven-week seminar on estate planning to be held in the Farmington Community Center and Community House in Birmingham.

Mrs. Amy von M. Morse, program coordinator and originator, says all aspects of estate planning will be discussed in the seminar which is "designed to provide information most valuable in analyzing estates, including many ways to save money and avoid costly pitfalls."

Mrs. Morse, a stockholder of the Holiday Inn in Southfield, is a life member of the Women's Round Table and Equitable Life Assurance Society.

The seminars will be from 8 to 10 p.m. Tuesdays, starting Sept. 25, in the Farmington Community Center at 24105 Farmington road, and from 8 to 10 p.m. Thursdays, starting Sept. 27, in the Birmingham Community House at 389 S. Bates.

### ORDINANCE NO. C61 CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS VACATION OF PUBLIC ROADS

An Ordinance to provide for the vacation, discontinuance or abolition of road, street and alley.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.  
Whenever the Council shall deem it advisable to vacate, discontinue or abolish any road, street or alley, or any part thereof, it shall by resolution so declare, and in the same resolution shall appear a flow when it will meet and hear objections thereto.

Section 2.  
Notice of such meeting shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Farmington Hills at a meeting thereof duly called and held on the 10th day of September, 1973, and copies shall be given by first class mail to the owners of all property abutting such highway, street or alley, as shown upon the assessment rolls of the City.

Section 3.  
After such hearing the Council shall determine to vacate, discontinue or abolish such road, street or alley, it shall do so by resolution. The Council may reserve an easement for public or private utility purposes within the right of way of any road, street or alley vacated, discontinued or abolished, and may by resolution extinguish any such easement whenever such easement ceases to be used for such utility purposes.

Section 4.  
No Ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 5.  
The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one (21) days after passage hereof.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the City Council of the City of Farmington Hills at a meeting thereof duly called and held on the 10th day of September, 1973, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by the Charter of the City of Farmington Hills.
