

Bus Line Transfer Deal Made

Two new customer services designed to encourage wider use of the regional bus systems were announced Monday by William C. Marshall, chairman of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority.

Marshall, president of the Michigan AFL-CIO, announced a new transfer policy which will permit Detroit riders to transfer to suburban buses at a reduced

rate, saving them as much as 50 cents a day.

He also announced a centralized telephone information service where bus riders can call to get route and schedule information on Metropolitan Transit, Great Lakes Transit, Lake Shore, Martin Lines and the Pontiac system.

Information on all the routes can be obtained by calling the Detroit number of 962-5515 or the suburban toll

free number of 800-482-5161.

Information on some DSR routes will also be available including transfer points.

The information service is open from 6 a.m. until 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. The new transfer policy allows DSR bus passengers to get a free SEMTA suburban transfer which allows them a 25 cent discount when they transfer to a suburban bus line.

DSR riders can get the

free transfer from the bus driver before transferring to a suburban bus line. The suburban bus driver will detach the lower portion of the transfer, and riders will pay 25 cents less the regular fare.

On return trips, passengers will give the remaining portion to the suburban bus driver and again pay 25 cents less.

Suburban bus drivers don't give transfers to change

from suburban buses to the DSR buses. A rider must be on a DSR bus first to get a transfer. Thus, a rider who lives in the suburbs and works in Detroit will have to get a transfer on his return trip in the evening for the next morning.

Riders can obtain a suburban transfer for a 25 cent discount when transferring from one suburban bus to another.

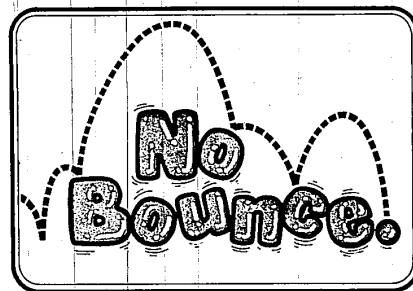
