

# Max Davey Singers Plan FCC Benefit

A special benefit performance by the Max Davey Singers and Orchestra will be presented Dec. 7, in Ford Auditorium for the benefit of the Farmington Community Center. A regular performance is scheduled for Dec. 8.

The special performance is planned to help the FCC raise funds to meet its 1973 budget. The goal is to sell tickets to raise \$10,000.

The concert, "Another Night To Remember," will feature music in a lighter vein for the holidays. Special guest will be opera star Calvin Marsh who will perform in "Rigoletto" with Detroit's Overture to Opera this fall.

This will be the 21st concert by the Max Davey Singers since 1964. Performances are presented each year in Dec. and April.

Outstanding artists appearing in past concerts included Jerome Hines, Pat Boone and family, Andrew Gainey and Steve Kimbrough.

Organized in 1962 as a non-profit organization, the Max Davey Singers assist various missionary societies with funds raised from concert series.

Enthusiastic support for



the group performances resulted in moving the concerts to Ford Auditorium. The group includes approximately 40 singers and a full state orchestra.

Max Davey, a Farmington resident and member of the FCC Board of Directors, works as a free lance automotive designer. Also an accomplished musician, he plays trumpet.

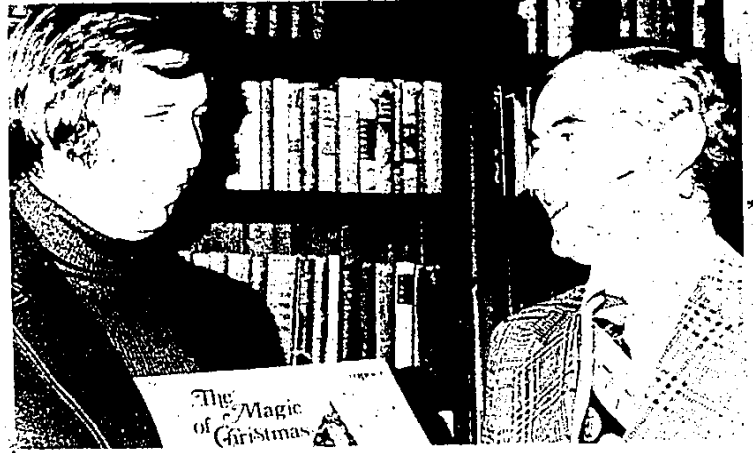
The Farmington Community Center serves approximately 20,000 persons each year from the northwest Detroit area. More than 350 classes are scheduled each year.

The center serves as a meeting place for clubs and organizations, hosts many activities, such as its annual antique show and outdoor concerts, and offers accommodations for wedding receptions and special community events.

The center is supported only by income from events held in the center and donations from business and the community.

"Many activities in the center are by nature not self-supporting," said Robert Amori, president of the FCC Board of Directors.
