Which means Northville Downs, pioneer track for parimutuel wagering on standardbreds in Michigan, would not have summer dates for the first time.

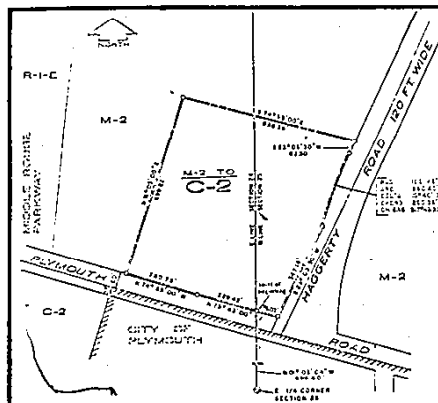

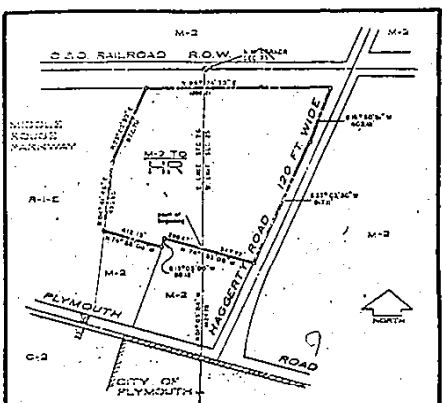
