we might be able to share," he added.

The money coming to the city for road improvement is not red tape free, however.

"The state allows only 25 per cent to be used on local roads. The council can increase that to 50 per cent, and I presume they will," Majoros said.

"This still leaves us \$300,000 to spend on major roads, and most are in pretty good shape already.

"People won't notice the improvement immediately, but we are going to put together an effective program," Majoros concluded.
