

Churchill wins 7th

Clarenceville cagers finally win, 65-53

Braun establishing a Churchill record. The 6-7 Charger center hauled in 25 rebounds to better his past season mark of 23 set against Farmington Harrison.

Southfield hit 19 of 56 from the floor for 33 per cent and Churchill 27 of 70 for 40 per cent. It was Churchill's seventh victory against one loss and for Southfield its fifth defeat against two wins.

Over at Garden City West, Chris Babler's Tigers struck a note of revenge over rival Garden City East.

East has held the upper hand in basketball the past two seasons, winning the city rival clash two years ago, 70-58, and 62-41 last season.

This year West got its revenge in 49-41 fashion.

The East Panthers took off to a 11-10 first quarter lead and held on at the half, 21-19. West finally put it together in the second half to outscore East, 30-20. Bob Peace was the sparkplug in the final

eight minutes with 10 points to head a seven for 11 floor showing.

West finished 20 of 47 from the floor for 43 per cent and East 17 of 56 for 30 per cent.

Farmington Harrison fell to its fifth defeat in seven games as Highland Park danced away to an 84-47 victory. A first half man-to-man attack for Highland Park kept Harrison in the game as the Hawks trailed only 32-23 at the half.

But all exploded in the second half as Highland Park hit for 22 in the third quarter and 30 in the fourth to finish with a 62 shooting per cent.

Westland John Glenn picked up its seventh win against three setbacks in a lopsided, 74-42 affair over Taylor Truman.

It was 18-12 at the end of one quarter, 38-21 at the half, with a 17-8 third quarter wrapping up the fate of the Truman club.

Glenn wound up 34 of 66 from the floor for 51 per cent

and Truman, 18 of 50 for 36 per cent. Terry Johnson was high man for Glenn with 21 points followed by Brian Kaluzny with 16 and Jim Kholman with 14.

Kaluzny hauled in 12 rebounds to pace Glenn to a 41-20 win in that department. Kaluzny upped his 10 game rebound total to 117.

Detroit Redford handed Thurston its fourth straight setback and seventh in eight games, 53-46.

Thurston led after one quarter but was outscored the rest of the way, 46-36.

Redford shot 38 per cent from the floor with Thurston showing 31 per cent. Four missed one- and one situations led to the Eagle downfall in the final minutes.

Dearborn High jumped on Livonia Stevenson in the second quarter and handed the Spartans their fifth loss in eight games, 55-42.

After a Dearborn, 12-10 first quarter, Stevenson came up with six turnovers in the second period. Dearborn popped in 17 points to Stevenson's seven and that was the game.

First year basketball coach at Clarenceville High Bob Wolf has to be looking optimistically towards 1974.

After his Trojans failed to break into the win column in seven outings to open the campaign, Wolf received his first laurel as a coach to start the new year.

Clarenceville topped Brighton, 65-53, to snap its two season losing streak at 13. The Trojans dropped their last six games of the 1972-73 season.

Brian Luke was the

sparkplug in the Trojan attack against a 4-4 Brighton team. Luka hit six from the floor and made good six of 15 from the charity line for a high of 21 points.

Brighton spurred to a 14-10 first quarter edge but the Trojans were yet to be heard from.

Luka picked up a hot hand in the second quarter, popped in seven of his 21 points and Clarenceville outscored Brighton, 23-13, to take a 33-27 lead at the half.

Clarenceville stretched its

lead to 10 points in the third and wound up with a 49-39 margin heading into the final eight minutes.

The closest Brighton got after that was eight points.

Clarenceville hit 23 of 50 from the floor for 46 per cent and Brighton had only 15 of 37 for 40 per cent.

The now 1-7 Trojans host Clarkson tonight (Friday).

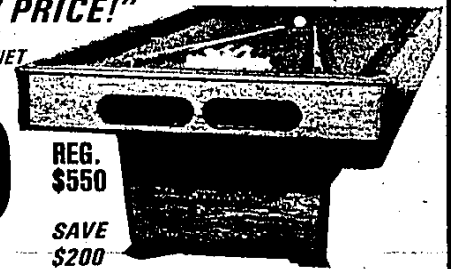
