

## Student travel studied

College presidents and transportation officials met at Schoolcraft College Tuesday to study the need for public transportation for college students living in southeast Michigan.

Richard Norris, president of St. Clair Community College and chairman of the Southeastern Michigan League of Community Colleges, called the meeting to investigate public transportation problems that are peculiar to college students who commute to school and jobs.

Representatives from the state department of transportation and Southeast Michigan Transit Authority participated in the closed meetings and offered to work closely with the colleges in solving transportation needs.

Participating colleges were Schoolcraft, St. Clair, Washenaw, Macomb County, Henry Ford Community Colleges and the University of Michigan - Dearborn campus, Oakland, Eastern Michigan and Wayne State Universities and the University of Michigan.


