Cooneys celebrate 50th anniversary

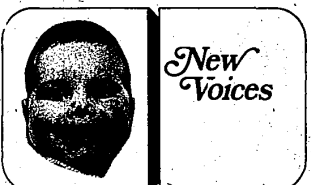

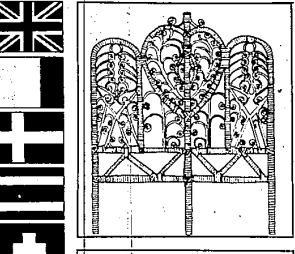

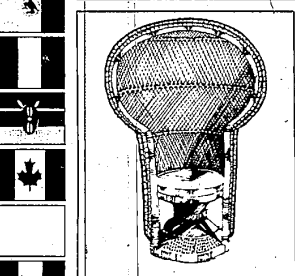
