Mrs. Edward Good will give the book review.

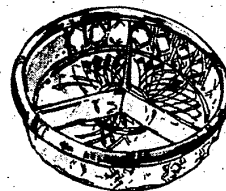

Employees 'adopt' daughter Maria

The employees at The Attic, located on Middle Belt Road in Farmington, have recently "adopted" a daughter, Maria, who lives in Burma, through the Foster Parents Mission Club, 3600 Oakland Ave., Detroit. It is an organization dedicated to aiding destitute Asian children.

The foster parents donate \$6 a month for one child's care, plus \$5 per year for the office expenses in Detroit. This amounts to \$76 a year, or less than 22 cents a day.

The adoption support is purposely kept at the barest minimum, so that more needy children may be cared for. The employees of The Attic probably will never get to meet Maria, but they will correspond.

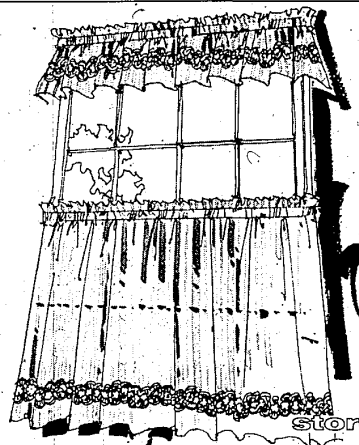

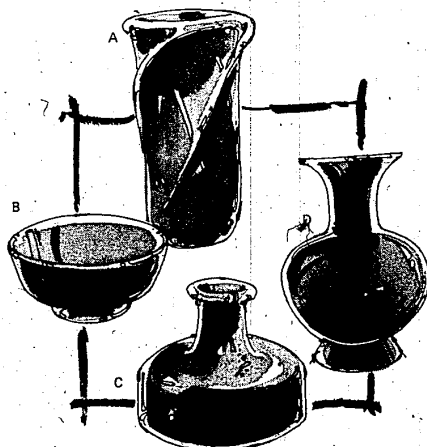
