Oakland YWCA sets workshop

Pre-Easter workshops will be conducted in March in the Oakland branch YWCA, 839 S. Crooks, Clawson.

Pysanky egg decorating will be demonstrated at a two-time workshop on Fridays, March 8 and 15. Registrants may join either a morning session from 9:30-12 noon, or the afternoon session from 12:30-3 p.m. The traditional Ukrainian designs will be shown.

A two-time workshop in bread dough sculpture will begin Tuesday, March 12 at 9:15 a.m. Women will learn how to make plaques, hankies, rings, small banks of jewelry from flour dough.

Also on March 12, a workshop on leaded stain glass decorations will be held between 1-3 p.m. How to make the sun catchers, free standing sculpture and the steps in building a full glass window will be covered.

Kuhn went to Alaska with Buchanan at the age of 11.

"I still can remember the first day I left and when I returned, it was all like a dream," he said.

"I WILL never forget the thrill of the trip as long as I live."

Kuhn conducts the trips so that today's boys can enjoy the same unforgettable experience.

"The steamer trip to Alaska is something the boys will never forget," he said.

"They'll see ice fall from the glaciers when the steamer's whistle blows; beautiful moving sunsets, and fjords rivaling those of Norway cut deep into the rugged mainland."

The entire three week trip will cover 8,000 miles and stop over at

the famous Banff Springs Hotel in the Canadian Rockies.

LEAVING BANFF for Jasper, they'll travel a spectacular scenic drive linking the major National Parks of the Canadian Rockies.

Included is an overnight stop at Timberline Lodge on Mount Hood in Oregon.

The trip starts from Detroit, June 26th, leaving on the Canadian National Train, and will include stops at Toronto and Edmonton. A bus trip to Calgary, Banff, Columbia Icefield and Jasper, culminates at Vancouver, B.C. where they will board the Canadian Pacific SS "Princess Patricia for a 7½ day cruise to Alaska."

The trip will take them along the Inside Passage to Skagway where they will board the White Pass and Yukon Railway, a narrow gauge

train for a trip up the Yukon along the trail of "56" to Lake Bennett.

IN ALASKA, the boys will visit Ketchikan, Juneau, Skagway, Wrangell and also make stops at Bartlett Cove.

Any good boy from anywhere in the United States and Canada who is willing to earn and save at least one-third of the cost by his own efforts is eligible to go.

The parents supply the balance. The purpose of the trip is to save for things worthwhile in life.

This is an all-expense trip which includes rail and steamer fares, transfers, hotels, sight-seeing, all meals, all taxes and tips while with the tour.

The cost is \$630 for boys under 12 and \$730 for boys 12 and over.

Body language skills crucial says expert

Dr. Cody Sweet, an expert in nonverbal communication, will speak at 1 p.m. on Monday, March 11 in the Mercy College of Detroit Student Center.

"The sexual aspects of body language have been far overplayed," she said.

Some recent books have concentrated almost entirely on dating behavior and neglected the importance of nonverbal behavior in other relationships such as teacher to student, boss to employee, salesman to customer and parents to children.

Dr. Sweet believes that skill in body language is as crucial to good communication as written or spoken language.

"It's not enough to talk and listen," Dr. Sweet says. "You have to watch as well. And a person's nonverbal behavior will often give you the real meaning of what he or she is saying."

Dr. Sweet's interest in body language began while she was a speech major and active in theater at Northwestern University.

Later she became an improvisational actress in Second city's Actor's Workshop.

She has earned a master of arts and doctor of philosophy degree from Northwestern and has post-doctoral credit from Harvard University and the New York Bureau for Movement Research.

Her areas of study were anthropology, psychology, and management along with performing arts.

Dr. Sweet is an internationally known speaker and a frequent guest on national TV talk shows.

She is president of her own company, Non-Verbal Communication, Inc. in Wilmette, Illinois which has programs for business, government, associations and educational groups whose employees have heavy contact with the public.

More Women Grad Students

The number of women going on to graduate school is increasing, especially at Michigan State University.

The university reports that the number of women graduate students rose to 2,771 this fall, up 283 from a year ago. It was the largest annual increase in more than 10 years.

Some of the largest gains in current graduate enrollment were in the university's medical colleges. Human medicine rose from 70 women graduate students last year to 97.

Bible study class meets Wednesdays

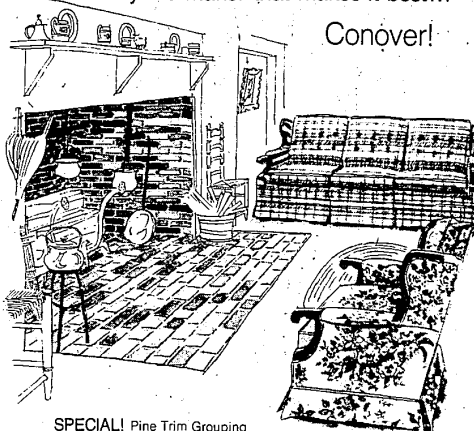

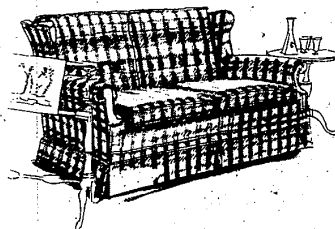

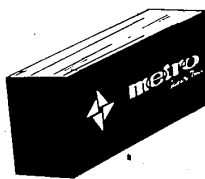
