

5 matmen in state finals

Five wrestlers from two area high schools are hoping to reach the peaks of their seasons this weekend in the state prep wrestling finals.

Four seniors from Country Day will compete in the state Class C championship meet at Haslett High School.

The fifth wrestler is Dave Leigh of Birmingham Seaholm who advanced to the state Class C tournament which will be held at Calvin College in Grand Rapids.

THE championship rounds in all four classes will be held Friday and Saturday beginning at noon on both days.

To reach the finals, the grapplers competed in regional tournaments last Saturday with the top four wrestlers in each weight class advancing to the finals.

Resident for hall fame

Birmingham's Watson Spoelstra, past president of the Baseball Writers Association of America, has been inducted into the Churchmen's Sports Hall of Fame.

Spoelstra was one of Detroit's foremost baseball reporters for nearly 40 years before his retirement last May.

He now works in public relations for evangelist Bill Glass, whose 12-year professional football career included four seasons with the Detroit Lions.

Spoelstra also is coordinator of the Major League Baseball Sunday chapel program.

Bill Snyder was the regional champion at 132 pounds. Ron Ber- man and Andy Duesser took seconds at 119 and 126 pounds, respectively. Robert Pastor was third in the 155 pound-class.

Campbell was very pleased with Snyder's winning performance.

"BILL DID better than I expected," the Yellow Jacket coach said. "He had an excellent day."

Many other coaches would love to have just four of their wrestlers still in competition. Campbell, however, said that he thought more of his wrestlers should have qualified.

The three Country Day grapplers who did not crack the top four were senior Dave Honigman in the 98-pound class, senior David Lucacu at 167 pounds, and junior Jeff Matte at 145 pounds.

"WE HAD a good day at the district but a bad one at the regional," the Country Day coach said.

What does Campbell think of his team's chances in the state meet?

"We should do reasonably well," he commented.

SEAHOLM

Leigh has been a very pleasant surprise for Maple coach Larry Fillar.

The Seaholm junior was the only wrestler from his school to survive district competition and for a while it seemed that his success would end there.

He lost his first match which pitted him against the number one seed in the 155 pound-class, Pat Ryan of Detroit Catholic Central.

LEIGH THEN stormed back to win three matches in a row and clinch third place in the Roseville regional.

For him to advance so far after a season his coaches termed "mediocre" has been surprising.

"I think he froze in the first match because of the excitement," Fillar said.

"WHEN HE warmed up, though, he overcame it. He then completely dominated his opponents."

Can Leigh continue his success in the state finals?

"He's progressed so much, he can place if he wants to," Fillar said. "He's really determined."

"We went to a full court man-to-man in order to get ready for the state tournament," Fox said.

"Lutheran North is a young team that is constantly improving," said Fox.

"We beat them by more than 20 points at their gym the first time we met but only beat them 56-49 later in the year when we had them in our home gym."

ROYAL OAK St. Mary and Southfield Christian are included with Roesper and Lutheran North in the Kimball district. Fox looks for St. Mary to be the pre-tourney favorite.

"St. Mary didn't have a great regular season record but they did play much tougher competition than the rest of us did," said Fox.
