WESTLAND — A state-wide cam-paign to impeach President Richard Nixon will "go public" this week in Westland

The state committee has issued 21 reasons it feels Mr. Nixon should have charges brought against him by the House of Representatives for a trial in the Senate.

The committee said the president and his subordinates have "fostered,

and his subordinates have "fostered, tolerated, and attempted to conceal the worst political scandals in this nation's history,"

It claimed that Nixon has repeatedly kept information about the Watergate issue from the public despite public promises of cooperation.

The committee cited his "interference with freedom of the press" through wiretaps of reporters and Federal Bureau of Investigation probes; impounding of funds approved by Congress; elleged unethicial and illegal tax deductions; and his alleged coverup of the Watergate issue. Johnson said the 18th District impeachment petitions aren't just a Democratic Party effort to get Nixon out of office or a partisan effort. He and Mrs. Shivers said much of their support has come from Republicans and former Nixon supporters. Although the Democratic Party has gone on record as endorsing the petition drive, the party has yet to finan-

iailly support the campasign.

Den organized labor has yet to feel the problem is just a Republic state committee.
