# Schools ok contract for service workers for other benefits, Candela explained. Lave days for 12-month maintenance and custodial employes were reduced from 18 days to nine days and for 10-month esteria and transportation employes from 15 days to eight. The former contract expired Dec. 31, 1973, but was extended during the negotiations. The new contract will expire Dec. 31, 1976.

By BARBARA UNDERWOOD BLOOMFIELD HILLS - A three-year contract for the 182 auxiliary services employes of the Bloomfield Hills School District was ratified by the board of educa-tion at its regular meeting Tues-day

was rathied by the board of education at its regular meeting Tuesday.

The contract previously had been ratified by the employes, members of Local 1384 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employes (AFSCME), by a two-to-one vote. The union members are the cafeteria, transportation, maintenance and custodial employes of the district.

The contract provides for a 15-cent per hour wage increase each of the first two years, except for cafeteria employes who will receive nine cents per hour increase the first year and seven cents per hour the second year.

The contract has a wage reopen reclause for the third year, in addition, a cost of living provision is included, calling for adjustments in January and July each year not o exceed eight cents per hour.

CAFFTERIA WORKERS received a smaller wage increase than the other employes because that the other employes because their hourly rates were more equitable with others in the county in the same job market, according to John A. Candela, director of personnel and labor relations.

The contract also provides added fringe benefits, short term disability benefits and compensation for jury duty in an amount equal to the difference between the employe's salary and that paid by the county for jury duty.

Life insurance will be increased \$1,000 each year of the contract, to a maximum of \$8,000 in the third year.
