## Pontiac Northern defeats Farmington High

The meet was closer than the score indicated, but Farmington High lost to Pontiac Northern, 73-50, in an Inter-Lakes track meet Thursday.

"They had pretty good speed," said Farmington track coach Gerald Young. "I'm happy with our performance. We just don't have that kind of speed. We did a good job, we had some good times."

Farmington won three track and two field events. Mike McGuire won the mile in 4:33.2 and VanMeeter won the two-mile in 10:17.5. The Falcons won the 440 relay in :44.9. Moore won the shotput with a toss of 42'7", and

Kevin Rathiff won the pole vault with a vault of 11'.  
 "They were real tough in the sprints and relays," Young said. "One kid, Washington, was especially tough. He won the 40 in :51.1 and that's exceptional."  
 Washington also won the high jump with a jump of 5'8". Pontiac Northern took all three places in the 100 yard dash and Northern's Greene won the 200 yard jump and placed in the 100.  
 "We had a couple close races, a close half mile and a close high jump. A few points here and there and the winners could have easily been us."  
 The Falcons are now 1-4 overall and 1-1 in Inter-Lakes play. The league

meet is May 22, and defending champion Livonia Stevenson is the favorite.  
 Farmington runs against Detroit Redford at home on Tuesday.
