Cheese handy for appetizer

Several kinds of cheese are produced in commercial, quantities in Michigan, with greatest production in Arenac, Clare. Menominee and Wextord counties, according to marketing, officials of the Michigan Department of Agriculture. There are 15 cheese factories located throughout the state and cheese made from whole milk totaled 31.8 million pounds in 1972.

If unexpected guests drop in, pre-pare a hot cheese appetizer on the spot Trim the crusts from four slices, of white bread. Cut into four strips. Brush with non-fourth cup melted but-ter. Divide one-half cup of grated Cheddar cheese on each strip. Place on a baking sheet and bake in a 350 degree preheated oven from five to seven minutes until bread is toasted and cheese melted. This makes 16 de-licious strips.

Hostesses also can prepare an appetizer cheese-roll a day or two in advance. Whip two (three ounce) packages of cream cheese with two cups of shredded Cheddar cheese and one-third cup crumbled Blue cheese. Shape into a roll about eight inches long, two inches in diameter. Roll in chopped parsley and wrap tightly. Chill in refrigerator.
