The bus is bound for the "Twilight of the Medici" exhibit at the Detroit Institute of the Arts. Next on the agenda is a trip to Keatington Antique Village, then a host of summer dates for Stratford and Meadow Brook. The package deals are made available to Farmington residents by the Farmington Community Center.

Buses are continually leaving the Farmington Community Center parking lot. They can be found for almost any destination, near or far, expected or unexpected. This summer will see the addition of several new bus activities there. Horseback riding lessons head the list. Two evenings at the Meadow Brook Festival are planned, and three trips to Stratford are a possibility. It is essential that interested individuals call the center immediately to reserve space on the bus for 'Pericles' at Stratford June 26. It will leave at 8:30 a.m. with tourists toting a lunch to be eaten at the picnic grounds overlooking the Avon swans. Dinner reservations will be made at the attractive Victorian Inn with the return to Farmington scheduled for immediately afterwards. The day's outing is \$28. 'Pericles' is a repetition of last summer's successful revival. It is a seldom-staged but widely acclaimed romance that follows a Greek prince through a series of incredible adventures.

LATER TRIPS to Stratford for performances of 'Love's Labour's Lost' will follow the same format and will be taken on July 10 and Aug. 21. One of Shakespeare's least known plays, it has enjoyed new popularity during this century. It is youthfully exuberant, given to flights of language, and replete with comic characters. Evenings at Meadow Brook are on the agenda for June 28, when Tony Bennett will be performing and Aug. 4, when Roger Williams will be at the piano keyboard. Early reservations are requested for both of these. An explanatory meeting about the riding classes will be held at the Center June 11, at 7:30 p.m. Sally Chasteen, coordinator of the program, will show films about riding and the facilities provided at Oak Ridge Farms where the lessons will take place. These classes will not be limited to youngsters, but will be scheduled for all age groups at different times of the week. Summer events at the center are selected with an eye to casual informality and fun. They will also include some old favorites, now almost a matter of popular demand.

Novi man announces candidacy

A Novi City Council member has announced his candidacy for the office of Oakland County Commissioner for the 24th District, which includes Farmington Hills. Louis C. Campbell, 42, will oppose Republican incumbent, Lew L. Coy, in the Aug. 6 primary election. The general election will be held Nov. 5. "In recent years, our district has not enjoyed adequate representation. We are, as a result, a forgotten area in Oakland County and have not received our fair share of county services. "If you need proof of this, simply look at the county road and drainage situation in most areas of our district," Campbell said.

THE CANDIDATE was born in Pineville, Ky., and graduated from the University of Wyoming in 1956 with a degree in civil engineering. Campbell is employed by the Detroit Gas Products Co. of Royal Oak. He has served on the Novi Zoning Board of Appeals, and was appointed to an unexpired term on the Novi City Council in 1970, then elected to a full term in 1973. Campbell is a past president of the Novi Rotary Club and a member of the Redford Lodge No. 152 F&AM, the Northville Commandery of the Knights Templar and the American Welding Society. The candidate, his wife, Eileen, and their three daughters reside in Novi.

Board seeks 3 millages

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — The township board agreed Tuesday to place three millage proposals for the purchase of open space on the November ballot. Township officials have their eyes on three parcels: • The eastern half of the Echo Park property adjacent to township offices, to be used for storage of abandoned and wrecked autos and road maintenance equipment as well as open space. The property is expected to cost more than \$100,000. • A 30-acre site at the northwest corner of Square Lake and Adams roads, valued at \$400,000 by the State Highway Department. • The 100-acre Turtle Lake Farm located on Square Lake. Road west of Telegraph. No price has been placed on this property.
