Hinged bus on trial here

MAN Germany's largest manufac-turer of public transit vehicles has provided a standard hinged bus for demonstration and testing on regular routes for suitability and passenger ac-ceptance in the United States.

The bus is on tour through major U.S. cities and will be in Detroit this

The bus was introduced July 9 on the SEMTA Metropolitan Division Michigan Avenue-Wayne Line.

OPERATED by one person, the bus has a seating capacity of 62 compared with 50 on regular buses now in use in the Detroit area. Powered by a 253 horsepower engine which meets California emmission standards, the 54 feet long demostration bus will reach a top spend of 50 mph! The bus is primarily designed for service in heavily populated metropolitan jareas.

SEMTA officials are considering purchase of up to 25 of these buses for use in [the region. If purchased, the
