Burke is candidate for 2nd judgeship

FARMINGTON—Residents of Farmington and Farmington Hills should be fully aware of the jurisdiction of the district court and the effect it has on their lives before they elect a new judge, according to attorney John W. Burke.

Burke is one of 12 beople running in the primary for the new second judgeship in the 47th District Court.

"The electorate should be aware that the vast majority of civil and criminal matters within Farmington and Farmington Hills are disposed of in the 47th District Court," he said.

"Although only a small percentage of the electorate will ever appear before the court they should elect a judge who will conduct himself in such a manner as to protect the right of all parties to a fair and impertial hearing."

Burke is a partner in the legal firm of Ingle and Burke, and is engaged in the general practice of law.

He received his BS from Wayne State University and his law degree from the Detroit College of law.

BURKE SAID state financing of district courts would help dispel

any feeling among the residents of the community that there may be a conflict of interest when a judge makes a ruling on a municipal ordinance.

He thinks that the plea bargaing system is a necessity in the judicial system.
"If every case went to court with a jury trial we could need more judges, more jurors, more clerks, and more money, to keep the docket from getting too backed up" he said.

He does think that the right to trial by jury is a constitutional right which is granted to each differed and if they request it and should not be eliminated, even for minor crimes.

Burke suggested that Oakland County follow the lead of Wayne County and establish a civil service system for the assistant prosecutor.

"If that system were adopted I think it would help to maintain some continuity of personnel in the assistant prosecutors office," he said.

BURKE SAID he thinks that district court judges do have the right to rule on the constitutionalright to rule on the constitutional ity of local ordinances.
"I know there is some question

about the jurisdiction of a district judge having the right to declare an ordinance unconstitutional." he said.

"It is my view that he does have this right. I would not hesitate to rule on the constitutionality of a local ordinance if it were shown to be unconstitutional."
