Franklin band holding concert

The Franklin Village Band will make its 10th appearance at the Farmington Founders Festival with a one hour concert on Thursday, July 25, at 7:30 p.m. at the Downtown Shopping Center, in conjunction with the crowning of the Festival Queen. The band is managed by William Ellison.

This 30-piece, full-balanced brass concert band has been organized for 14 years, and now has over 450 arrangements. Their program is tailored for each occasion but generally features American composers such as Sousa, Stephen Foster and Cole Porter.

The Franklin Village Band, under the direction of Dr. Conrad Lam, is comprised of people from various occupations, with an age rank of 18 to 73, from the Franklin area including Farmington. The band makes many annual appearances and was in Washington, D.C. in the spring as part of the precentennial festivities.

Mini-marathon to register

FARMINGTON — Would you like to try a long distance footrace? The Farmington Area YMCA is sponsoring a 10 mile Mini-Marathon race during the Farmington Founders Festival. The race is for amateur athletes, both male and female, and is scheduled to begin at 9 a.m. on Saturday, July 27th. The starting point is the Farmington Hills City Hall, 11 Mile Road at Orchard Lake Road; registration begins there at 8 a.m.

Entry forms for the Mini-Marathon can be obtained by calling or coming into the Farmington Area YMCA, 28100 Farmington Road just north of 12 Mile Road. The entry fee is \$3 and can be paid at the start of the race. Young runners under 18 years must have their parent's signature on the entry form. The race is sanctioned by the Michigan A.A.U. and those who are not A.A.U. members can register at the race for an additional \$2.

There will be two classes of runners: those under age 40 (Open Division) and those 40 and over (Masters division). There will be at least three merchandise prizes awarded in each division and also medals through the first eight places. Fred Lindholm, YMCA Community Program Director, remarked "There were many runners at the 1973 race who were either 40 or older and 18 and under. We hope to have most of these runners back again this year."

Jerry Young, track coach at Farmington High School and chairman for the event, said "There will be many Farmington runners and Diane Spitz, the 1973 winner of the Mini-Marathon has said that he intends to run again this year. His winning time last year was 49 minutes and 41 seconds."
