Jaycee service award is given to John Borbi

FARMINGTON — John Borbi, president of the Farmington Area Advisory Council "Rapline" is this year's recipient of the Farmington area Jaycees Distinguished Service Award.

"The Jaycees give this award annually to an individual who is active in community affairs," Dick Taylor, president of the Jaycees said.

William Pratt teacher of year

FARMINGTON — William L. Pratt, an instructor at Harrison High School, is this year's Outstanding Young Educator.

The Outstanding Young Educator award is an annual award presented by the Farmington area Jaycees to a teacher in the Farmington school district between the ages of 18-35.

The award is given on the basis of the individual's community and educational activities.

Jaycee President, Dick Taylor said, "The award was given to Bill Pratt in recognition of the fact that he is dedicated to his job and to the people of this community, and in appreciation for the number of hours, outside of his job that he has spent involved in activities for the community."

A resident of Troy, Pratt is an instructor of electronics, electricity, and vocational electronics at Harrison High School.

HE IS DEPARTMENT chairman for industrial arts at Harrison and serves as the coach for the junior varsity, wrestling and baseball teams at Harrison.

Pratt has organized and developed vocational electronics classes at Harrison and Farmington High Schools and is currently rewriting the lab textbooks for electronics classes.

His textbook, which is being published by Oakland County, will be used in classes throughout the area.

Aside from his involvement in Farmington activities, Pratt is also involved in the Little League and the Scouting programs in Troy.

He was chosen as the recipient of the award by a committee made up of members of the Jaycees, and one outside member.

APPLICATIONS FOR the award were submitted to the com-

mittee by the administrators at the district's schools.

Pratt was presented with a plaque honoring him as Outstanding Young Educator of the year at the Jaycees annual rodeo.

In presenting the award Taylor said, "William Pratt is a young man who has exhibited an extraordinary interest in the youth of the Farmington area."

Patrick McDonald, candidate for the Democratic nomination in the 17th Congressional District, says he has found six main areas of concern in his door-to-door campaigning through the district.

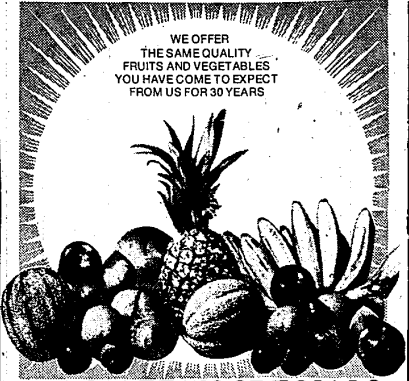
taxation, impeachment, campaign reform and education. Residents also discussed busing, jobs, health care and corporate responsibility with McDonald.
