Costumes, produce add to festival

Vintage costumes and fresh produce will add a colorful note to the activities at the Plymouth 1974 Fall Festival, Sept. 5-8.

A slice of old Americana will be provided by the Costume Competition. Authenticity is demanded in this AAUW-sponsored contest which will highlight the 1850-1890 period.

The costumes must be authentic or a good reproduction and complete in detail except for footwear. Categories will include: family, two or more adults with children; children, persons up to age 14; and adult, persons age 14 and over.

First, second and third prizes (six each) will be awarded. The contest will be Sunday, Sept. 8, with judging from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m. behind the bandstand in Kellogg Park. Winners will be announced at 3 p.m.

THE PRODUCTS of Michigan's farms and gardens will be featured in the produce exhibition and competition sponsored by the Rotary Club.

Farmers, commercial retailers and residents of all ages are eligible to enter the competition.


This year the first four categories

will be judged separately. All entries must be Michigan grown.

THE CATEGORIES are:

1. A wheelbarrow of mixed garden vegetables attractively displayed.
 2. Five bushels of pumpkins and/or squash arranged in a pile, using any variety of mixture.
 3. A bushel of husked sweet corn.
 4. A small pyramid of home grown muskmelons.
- Other categories will be:
1. Soy beans—the plant with the most pods.
 2. Indian corn—an eight-eared bundle of husked corn.
 3. Tall corn—the tallest stalk of any kind of corn, measured from the ground to the tip.
 4. Largest pumpkin or squash.
 5. Old-fashioned bouquet of fresh garden flowers.
 6. Tallest sunflower with largest blossom.

Ribbons for first, second, third place and honorable mention will be awarded in each category. Entries must be placed under the exhibit's tent in Kellogg Park by 1 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 8. Ribbons will be awarded to winning entries around 3 p.m.
