

Catholic woman gets top award

Her first reaction was "Oh, no, I don't want to be nominated."
But now Mrs. George Quin, 851 Hazelwood, Birmingham, is proud to have been named Catholic Woman of the Year by the 1974 Convention of the Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women.

"I was chairing a board meeting of the women of Holy Name Catholic Church when my third vice-president told me they were nominating me," Mrs. Quin said.
Mrs. Bette Stephenson and Fr. Bernard Harrington pastor of Holy Name, submitted a resume of Mrs. Quin's activities to the archdiocese which includes all of Oakland, Macomb and Wayne counties.

FIFTY NOMINATIONS were submitted by various parishes but only eight women received awards.
In addition to serving as president of Holy Name Women's Council for two years, Mrs. Quin also is first vice-president of the Birmingham-Bloomfield Branch of the League of Women Voters. Other positions she holds are

chairman of the health clinic at Covington Junior High School and delegate from Holy Name to the Church Women United of Birmingham.
Mrs. Quin will continue to serve on the board at Holy Name as past president for one year.
"I'M NOT too much on luncheon and card parties so I really enjoy service and the league work," she said.
She thinks she would like to add the Birmingham Youth Assistance to her list of service projects.

Jewish congregations form council

Representatives of orthodox, conservative and reform congregations in the Metropolitan area announce the formation of the Synagogue Council of Greater Detroit.

The new organization, which comprises most of the major congregations in the community, has as its prime purpose the affirmation and strengthening of the synagogue as the central force in the religious life of the community.

The objectives of the council have been outlined as: discussing crucial problems facing synagogues; and establishing guidelines for the strengthening of the spiritual and material welfare of the community's synagogues.

Other purposes are to be of assistance to congregations having special problems; to provide a forum for the exchange of ideas and to meet common goals and objectives.

Services planned for New Year

Beth Abraham-Hillel Synagogue of West Bloomfield and its congregational family, joined by a group of new members who have affiliated recently, will usher in the New Year 5735 beginning with Rosh Hashanah services at 7 p.m. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, and 8 a.m. Tuesday and Wednesday.

Rabbi Israel I. Halperin, spiritual leader of the congregation, will officiate at all services and preach during the morning services Tuesday and Wednesday.
Cantor Shabtai Ackerman, senior cantor of the congregation, will chant the services with the synagogue choir directed by Associate Cantor Israel Fuchs. The year, for the first time, the congregation will provide each worshipper with a special booklet containing supplementary union prayers and responsive readings which complement the traditional high holiday prayers of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

A limited number of seats for non-congregational members are available from the synagogue, 5075 W. Maple Road.

RECENT SURVEYS and demographic studies indicate that less than 50 percent of the Jewish community is associated formally with a congregation, yet the synagogues serve over 90 percent of the Jewish community. The council will launch a campaign to stress the importance of each family joining the congregation which best fits its needs.
An effort will be made to provide an ongoing series of adult education programs, speakers and lectures as well as cultural programs for members of all synagogues.
