

# Speaker to study 'chariots of gods'

The possibility that "chariots of the gods from outer space" visited South America in ages past will be explored by James A. O. Crowe, outdoors editor of a Detroit newspaper, when he presents the premier showing of a new slide show at 7 p.m. Sunday.

The program at St. John's Episcopal Church, Woodward and Eleven Mile Road, Royal Oak, is

open to the general public. There is an admission fee for the benefit of the church.

Entitled "Ancient Mysteries," the hour-long presentation of color slides will be personally narrated by Crowe, a member of the church.

The showing is the result of recent trips he made to Colombia, Ecuador and Peru, the latest last January when he visited Machu

Picchu, the "lost city" of the Inca Empire; Cuzco, the ancient Inca capital; and Lima, the present capital of Peru.

On his trips, Crowe visited and photographed many of the sites of Inca and pre-Inca cities, shrines and fortifications as well as archaeological museums and the famed gold museums of Bogota and Lima.

At all these places, he examined the evidence produced for prehistoric space visits in the controversial books, "Chariots of the Gods" and "Gods from Outer Space" by Erich Von Daniken. A much discussed movie and a television special were based on the books.

Von Daniken contends that highly advanced beings from some far distant galaxy left behind evidence of their landings and that they inspired the development of the Inca civilization.

## Unitarians mark 150th birthday

Unitarian Universalists in the greater Detroit area will begin the year with a special in-gathering service at the First Unitarian Church in Detroit at 4 p.m., Sunday, Sept. 22.

The service will present "Walden," a Unitarian Universalist celebration assembled by Darrell Eubank of Grosse Pointe to commemorate the occasion. Walden is based on Henry David Thoreau's American classic, "Walden,

or Life in the Woods," and music of Franz Schubert.

The musical dramatic adaptation of Thoreau's book includes dance, song, and a visual setting designed to evoke the essences of Thoreau's Unitarian view of the environment and his own personal development as a human being.

Participants in the service will be soprano Jerry Todd of Bloomfield Hills; Carol Manetta, principal dancer of the Harbinger Dance Group of the Detroit Community Music School; and pianists Doris Dubank and Carol Solenberger. Darrell Eubank will appear in the role of Thoreau.
