
Brother Rice shatters Southfield, 41-7

Southfield High distinguished itself by being the first team to score against all-powerful Birmingham Bruther Rice this season.

Coach Al Fracassa's Rice team steamrolled Southfield, 41-7, last Friday before 2,500 at Southfield. The capacity crowd watched the Warriors pile up 278 yards on the ground and add 108 more through the air.
