

Franklin hands NFHS a history lesson

Pressure? Livonia Franklin has never heard that teams crack under it. And kicker Dan Quinn doesn't buckle under it.
The Patriots are now a 7-0 club and No. 1 in the Northwest Suburban league after Quinn's 28 yard field goal gave Livonia Franklin a 23-22 victory Saturday over the North Farmington Raiders with just over a minute left in the game.
If Quinn's kick won the game, a Raider fumble insured the victory as Franklin recovered the ball on the North Farmington 33 yard line.

ALL THE PATRIOTS has time to do was fall on the ball.
Down by a point at the half, the Patriots managed to hold on, get

Quinn in field goal position late in the fourth quarter and win the game.
"There was never any doubt that Quinn could kick the field goal," said Patriot retiring head mentor George Lovich. "The only question in our mind was what down to attempt it."
Franklin drew first blood with a little help from the opposition. After receiving the opening kickoff and moving from the 18 yard line to the 25, Tim Hollandsworth recovered a North Farmington fumble on the 45 yard line.
Paul Downs passed for the first yardage of his 202 yard afternoon total, to get the ball to the North Farmington 20 yard line.
Two rushing plays netted slight yardage for the Patriots, so Downs

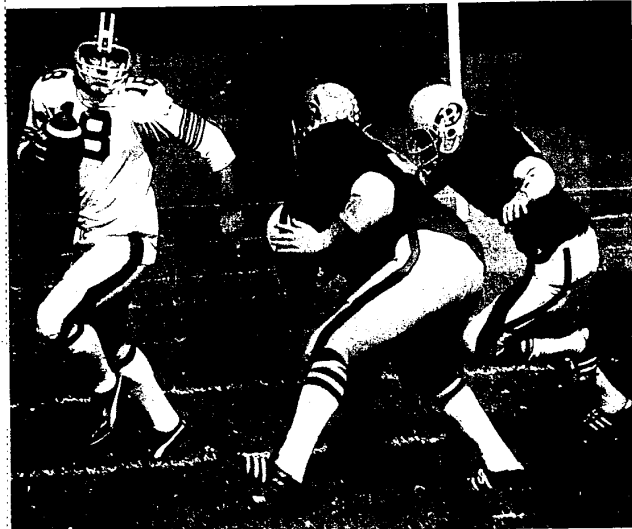
again went to the air, hitting his wide receiver Rick Varterasian for 13 yards and a touchdown.
QUINN'S KICK was good and the score was 7-0 Franklin.
But the Raiders marched right back as quarterback Tom Moore's pass was right on target to Bob Patek in the middle of a group of Livonia defenders.
Bill Lough capped the drive by racing into the end zone from four yards out.
With both teams showing excellent control of the football up to the minute mark in the quarter, a short kick gave the Patriots the ball on the Raider 28 yard line at the start of the second quarter.
Quick whistle blowing by the officials gave the Franklin team an

added boost, as a fumble recovery by North was disallowed.
The 28 yard scoring drive was capped by Downs's second touchdown pass, again to Varterasian for 16 yards and a 14-7 lead for the Patriots.
A blocked punt gave North Farmington the ball on the Franklin 15 yard line.
Sticking to the strong rushing game, the Raiders used only two plays for a touchdown, as Lough carried the ball in from 13 yards out.
Patek carried the ball into the endzone for two points and the Raiders took the lead for the first time with 1:31 remaining in the half.

THE RAIDERS held the lead until Quinn's field goal late in the fourth quarter.

In the third quarter, the Raiders took over on their own 16 yard line and moved over the midfield mark. The drive was capped with a fake handoff to leave Patek who scored giving the Raiders a 22-14 lead with just four minutes remaining in the quarter.
Taking to the air, Downs moved his team to the Raider 37 before punting.
With victory in sight, the pressure was on the Raiders to hang onto their eight point lead, gained when Franklin's try for a tie score went astray.
After a North fumble was recovered by the Patriots, Downs led the team from its own 32 to a touchdown, capping the drive with a 33 yard pass to wide receiver Bill Gunter.
Down by two, the Patriot defense held the Raiders deep in

their own territory, forcing the North Farmington team to punt.
With 5:14 remaining in the game, it was a do or die attempt for Franklin.
Using up time on the clock, the Patriots moved from their own 22 to the North Farmington 18 and left the finishing touch to Quinn.
North Farmington picked up 155 yards on the ground and 62 yards in the air for 217, slightly ahead of Downs's 202 yards in the air.
The Patriots added 77 yards rushing for a total yardage of 279.
Downs hit 13 of 26 passes for 50 percent, while Quinn led the Patriots on the ground with 37 yards in 16 carries.
The victors also picked up 13 first downs.
"Despite the great day our guys had on the field," Lovich said, "a lot of credit has got to go to the Franklin fans. They came right along with us, and the victory line before the second half gave the team a boost."
"This is the happiest day of my life," the head mentor added. "I couldn't ask for a finer bunch of ball players. They made my last year my best year."
