

Shaarey Zedek to honor its cantor emeritus

Congregation Shaarey Zedek will honor Cantor Emeritus Jacob Sonenklar on his 80th birthday in November. Sonenklar, a cantor for 59 years, 42 of them at Shaarey Zedek, will be feted at special Shabbat Services on Saturday, Nov. 9, at the synagogue in Southfield.

He will lead the services that day, be the subject of a sermon by Rabbi Irwin Groner and receive a gift from synagogue President Robert Steinberg on behalf of the congregation.

The services will be followed by a special Kiddush. As a permanent tribute, Shaarey Zedek has established the Cantor Jacob Sonenklar Fund to help acquire a music section in the synagogue's library.

INDIVIDUALS WISHING to honor the cantor on his 80th birthday may make contributions to this fund. Sonenklar, who retired a few years ago and took on the cantor emeritus title, still takes part in almost every Sabbath service, helps officiate on holidays and performs in musical programs at many synagogue events.

A native of Austria, he assisted in singing with a cantor from the age of 7. By the time he was 10, he already had attained some prominence throughout Austria with an unusual alto voice, assisting some of the most well-known cantors of those days. He trained as a cantor in Poland and, later in Vienna, received operatic training.

After World War I, he took his first position as cantor, officiating for four

years in Radotz, Bukovina, now Roumania.

HE REFUSED an offer to be first cantor in Czernowitz, capital of Bukovina, to come to a Chicago congregation where he served for 10 years.

In 1932, he received a call to come to Shaarey Zedek at its old Detroit location.

Sonenklar is a member of the De-

troit Cantors Association and the Cantors Assembly of America.

He frequently is featured in musical programs before many Jewish social, charitable and cultural organizations. Among these has been his annual appearance at a special Sabbath service at the Jewish Home for the Aged.

Chairman of the Sonenklar 80th Birthday Committee for the congregation is Mrs. Peter Martin.

McBride joined the Storer Broadcasting Station as program manager in 1961, was named news director in 1965, and served as director of communications until his appointment as station manager in 1974.

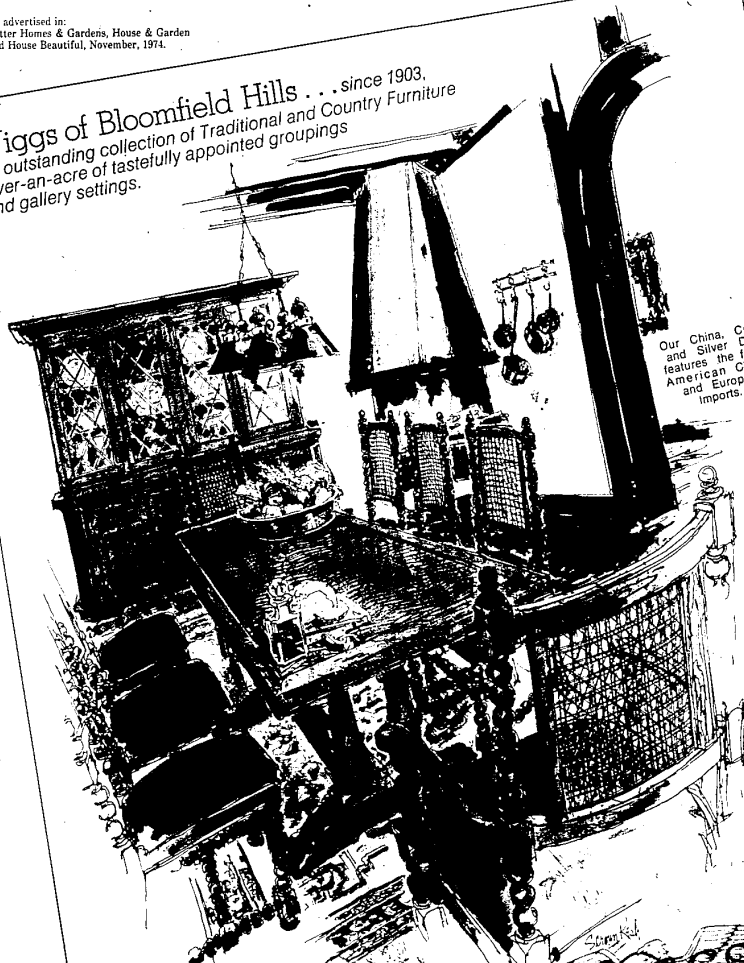

will explain the fellowships and research project programs of the AAUW.

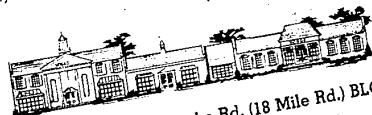
