## Wine tasters attend session

Torkild Nielsen will introduce pressings from Italy, France and Germany as well as some American wines to Farmington palates at a wine tasting session Friday, Nov. 15. The group will meet at Farmington Community Center at 8 p.m.

Americans are rapidly becoming knowledgeable wine consumers, according to Nielsen, whose services are much in demand. More and more often, partygoers are requesting a glass of dry white wine in place of the calorie-laden highball or cocktail.

Working with a selection of different varieties, Nielsen initiates the ability to distinguish subtle differences. He explains how to select the proper wine to accompany a meal.

Bread and cheese are served to cleanse the palate and ready it for its next taste experience. Otherwise, the taste buds would suffer from overkill.

Michigan's only registered wine sommelier, Nielsen has served on the staff of Schoolcraft, Henry Ford and Macomb County colleges. He will follow up this wine tasting evening with a full course of classes on wine appreciation during the winter term at the center which begins in January.

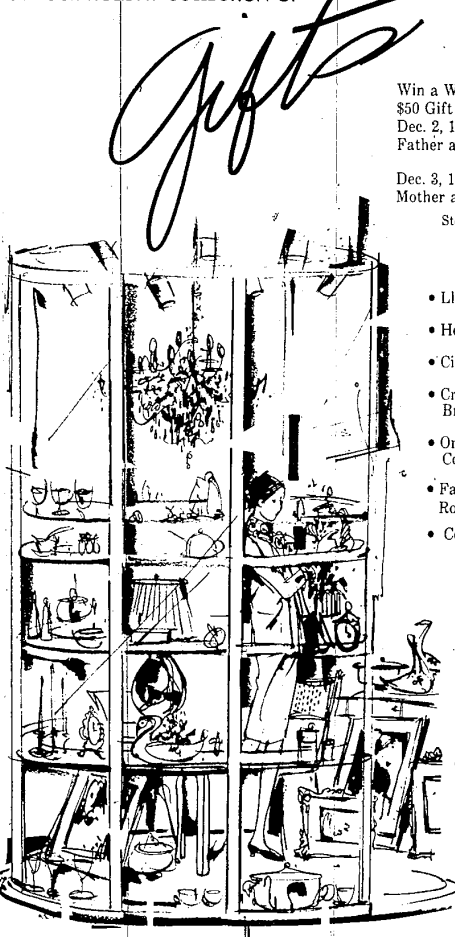

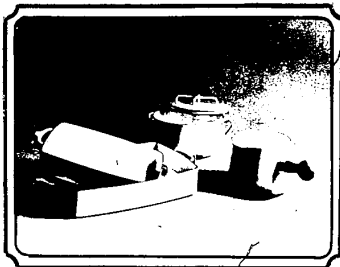
