MCA seminars scheduled at Eastern Michigan

The first comprehensive seminar to define and explain methods and techniques in applying for arts-related grant money from state, federal and private sources will be held Nov. 19 at Eastern Michigan University. "Grantmanship in the Arts" is co-sponsored by the Michigan Council for the Arts.

About 50 participants representing arts organizations in southeastern Michigan will explore sources of funds, including the Michigan Council, the National Endowment for the Arts and various private foundations and trusts.

Morning sessions will be devoted to providing detailed information as to sources and grant categories available. The afternoon activities will involve small discussion groups concentrating on a specific type of grant or area of concern.

Lee Katz, director of special projects and research development on the EMU campus, is general chairman of the conference assisted by members of the Michigan Council. The EMU meeting will be a pilot program to establish a format for similar conferences throughout the state during the next six months.

Dauch, Kearney reassigned by GM in manager shifts

After serving under six plant managers for the Livonia Chevrolet Spring and Bumper division and then devoting 10 years in Cleveland and Bay City, Bernard J. Kearney has returned to assume the duties of plant manager of the Livonia operation.

The announcement was made late last week when Richard Dauch, Spring and Bumper chief for the past year and a half, was appointed assistant zone manager of sales in Chevrolet's Detroit zone effective Nov. 1.

DAUCH, 32, joins the division's sales organization after 10 years serving in various Chevrolet manufacturing assignments.

Kearney joined Chevrolet in Toledo immediately following his graduation from St. John's High School. He received his bachelor's degree in industrial engineering from General Motors Institute and took post-graduate courses at the University of Toledo.

Following service in World War II, he was employed at the Chevrolet plant in Cleveland, Chevrolet central office and the Livonia plant. In 1958 he was named manager of the Cleveland Pressed Metal Plant and then became plant manager in Bay City in March 1972.

Dauch, a resident of Bloomfield Hills, began his career with Chevrolet in 1964 as a college graduate in train-

ing at the Flint Assembly plant. He was promoted to foreman in 1965, general foreman in 1967, superintendent for truck production in 1968, superintendent of inspection in 1971 and general superintendent in July 1971.

He was named plant manager at Livonia in 1973.

KEARNEY was first assigned to the Spring and Bumper plant in 1957 and served under plant managers Charles McKinney, R.B. Dow, A.W. Whitmer, Leo Seidl, Bert Anderson and Thomas Carroll before being transferred to Ohio in 1964.

"The years have brought many

major changes to the Livonia plant," he said Thursday in his first day on the new job. "All for the better I might say. But it's just like returning home to come back here where I served for so many years under so many plant managers."

Kearney and his wife, Irma, are parents of two sons, Bernie and Bill, both of whom are in General Motors programs.

The Kearney and Dauch promotions were among several top level appointments announced by James McLernon, general manufacturing manager. The changes placed new managers at five Chevrolet plants.
