

The Early Learning Center is a newly licensed facility for preschoolers over the age of three. The program for children is designed to provide an opportunity that gives the child the freedom to investigate, experiment and discover in a variety of areas.

FARMINGTON—Farmington artists John and Ruby Glick will open their first retrospective exhibit at 1 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 19, in Michigan State University's Pewabic Pottery, 10125 E. Jefferson Ave., Detroit.

Their Plum Tree pottery is well known in the art world, and their show is expected to attract collectors as well as serious art students. It will be open until 5 p.m. Sunday and then noon-4:30 p.m. Mondays through Saturdays, concluding March 1.

John Glick, who has his masters in fine arts from Cranbrook and was awarded a Tiffany grant for the creation of a studio, spent two years in Germany before buying and converting the farm building in which he and his wife, Ruby, also a potter, now ply their artistry.

Best known Glick works are teapots, casseroles, bowls, plates, mugs, covered jars, corded jars, pitchers, wine jugs, tureens, slab boxes and soap dishes.

Visitors to the show may tour the historic pottery, including the Pewabic Museum and the facilities for the MSU adult ceramic classes. Parking and admission is free.
