

Farmington Arts Council brings Nostalgia Concert

A concert of nostalgia, given by the Farmington Community Concert Band, will be presented in Harrison High School's auditorium on Friday, Jan. 30, at 8 p.m.

"Nostalgia Concert" is sponsored by the Farmington Arts Council and designed "for senior citizens to get out and active in the community," said Marlowe Belanger, president of the group, "but it's open to the public and we've also made arrangements to get the handicapped out for a night." A bus, 20 shuttle cars and a special van for the handicapped have been arranged for the night of music.

Representatives from the arts council have personally invited as many

groups of seniors and those in nursing homes as they could contact. But Mrs. Belanger said that any one who had not been contacted is invited to call Ed Dodson, at the Metropolitan Bank, to make transportation arrangements. Dodson can be reached by calling 476-1000.

The program for the concert has been planned by Paul Barber, director of the Community Concert Band, which will be made up of music from the past 75 years.

Among the concert pieces selected

are "American Overture For Band," "Chant and Jubilo" and a Barnum and Bailey circus favorite, "Fantasy on American Sailing Songs."

Evelyn Kreson, of the Michigan Ballet Theater, will bring her company into the performance for the last part of the concert. She is doing the choreography for a group of Philip Sousa marches, including "Thunder," "Semper Fidelis," and "Stars and Stripes Forever."

The concert was made possible by a grant from the Michigan Council of the Arts, to the local arts council.

A June wedding is planned.



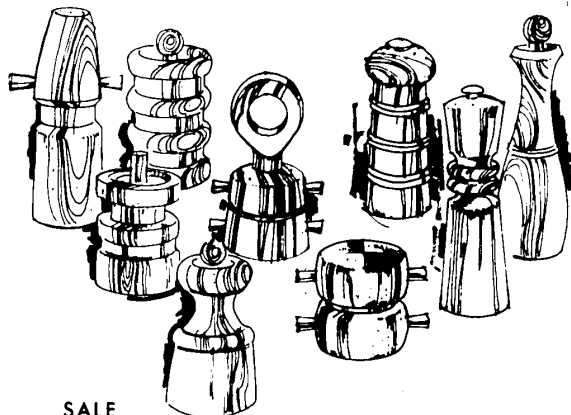
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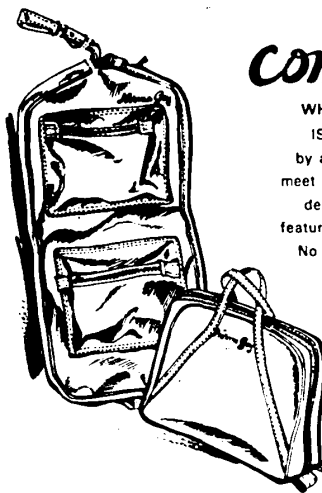


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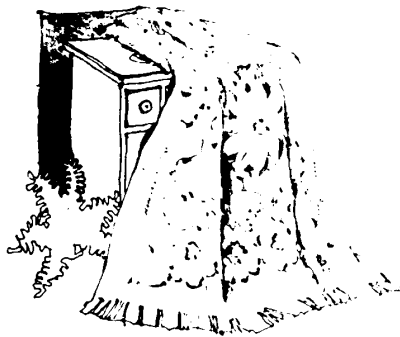
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
