This was a form of excitement and a way of proving how tough they were. Apparently for many men in the suburbs, playing around with the whole idea of guns and the dangers of the big city is a big male adventure.

Now I see times have changed so that fathers and men need to face the moral issue of hand gun control as a social rather than a personal safety issue. It is the sanity and survival of our whole society which is at stake in the issue of hand gun control. The issue behind, it is really the male "tough guy" role.

I call for concerned citizens to continue to push for hand gun control in the State of Michigan. This push for gun control is necessary not only because of the tragic consequences of murder and armed robbery but by the increasing emphasis on violence by guns in films and on TV. Current films such as "Freebie and the Bean" emphasize the violence of the hand gun as an exciting, playful male thing to do. The message seems to be it is adventuresome and even fun to carry


