"On Tuesday evening, we will honor our national president at a banquet at the Sussex House in Southfield," Mrs. Nemon said.

"Following the dinner, she will hear reports of Michigan projects for children, hospitalized veterans, veteran's families, scholarships, aid to Israel and the many other projects in which we are involved."

An official department meeting would follow the dinner, after which Mrs. Gotthoffer will address the members of Michigan auxiliaries.

Mrs. Gotthoffer will culminate her visit to Michigan in a luncheon conference with auxiliary presidents at the JWVA Memorial Home in Southfield.

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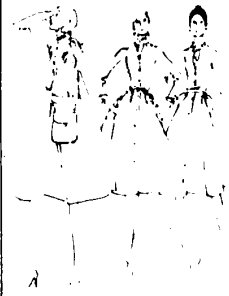
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'Divorce Adjustment' class offered at OCC

"Divorce Adjustment Seminar" will be offered on the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College starting Wednesday, Feb. 26. It is a five-session course held 7:30-9:30 p.m. for five consecutive Wednesdays.

The seminar is unique in the state, developed by Claire Orans, who will teach the course, with Mel Cranter, designed for divorced persons, those contemplating divorce, or those going through divorce proceedings.

"Participants in the class" will take a look at themselves, look at their life as a single person and we'll help pick up the pieces," said Ms. Orans.

We will discuss the individual's

self esteem and his self-concept, the communication aspect of talking with an ex-spouse, and ex-minors.

The seminar is aimed not to think of this as the end of the world but as the start of a second beginning and to adopt a better attitude about your self.

Ms. Orans lives in Farmington and has a master of arts degree in adult guidance and counseling. She specializes in post divorce counseling for adults and for children of divorced parents. This is the second seminar she will conduct for Oakland Community College.
