

Farmington 'Y' to begin spring course sessions

FARMINGTON—The YMCA will begin its spring session Monday, May 5. It will run for five consecutive weeks.

Courses will be offered in golf, tennis, transactional analysis, driver education, bellydancing, trimastics, men's fitness, business, women's fitness, yoga, ballet, judo and gymnastics.

Space is limited, and early registration is encouraged.

Proper swing techniques for golfers will be taught at the Top of the Tee by David T. Zielinski for both youth and adults.

In preparation for a safe and fun summer, the YMCA also will offer more than 30 swim classes for all levels from six months through adult. They will be held at Mercy Center, Eleven Mile and Middle Belt roads.
