DONALD J. LOGAN, of Birmingham, has been named director of management information systems at Sperry Vickers North American Group headquarters in Troy.

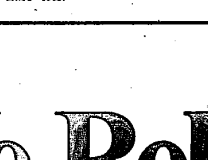
Logan joined the company in 1973 and has a 16-year management background in industrial administration.
