

Netter likes competition

Many years have passed since Leonard Brose won the Big Ten singles championship for Michigan State University.

But Brose, a 48-year-old Southfield resident, hasn't lost his taste for competitive tennis. Brose had little

trouble winning the men's 45 singles title at the Sibley Shores Tennis Tournament last weekend at the Detroit Tennis and Squash Club in Farmington Hills.

Brose defeated T.T. Tchen of Farmington, 6-1, 6-1. In the finals of the 45 singles, in the semifinals, Brose defeated Keith Kimble of Birmingham, 6-1, 6-2, while Tchen beat Morris Rosenbaum of Orchard Lake, 6-3, 5-7, 7-5.

Tchen, a 53-year-old biochemistry professor at Wayne State University, is no stranger to Brose. The two men played on a squash doubles team which competed in the state AAU tourney several years ago.

First place in the 45 singles earned \$300 for Brose and \$200 for Tchen.

"I'm not in it for the money," said Brose, a manufacturer's representative for several furniture companies. "I like the competitive aspect of the game better than just playing for fun. If I'm not getting ready for a tournament, then I usually don't play too much. I guess it's just a quirk in my personality."

CHUCK BRAINARD of Bay City won the men's singles competition, defeating defending champion John Hainline of Troy, 5-7, 6-3, 6-2, in the finals. Brainard, the professional at the Bay Valley Tennis Club, stopped Rudy Hernandez of Hamtramck, 6-2, 6-4, in the semifinals. Hainline beat Hans Gilmester of Chle, 6-2, 7-4.

In the men's 35 singles, Joe Bachmann of Columbus, Ohio, upset top seeded Mark Jaffe of Eastonville, Mich., 4-1, 6-2, in the finals. In the semifinals, Bachmann beat Joe Osada of Toronto, 6-1, 6-2, while Jaffe defeated Frank Barnett of Columbus, Ohio, 6-0, 6-2.

The women's singles finals had a young look. Top seeded Wendy Burkhart, 15, defeated 18-year-old Debbie Mascarin of Grosse Pointe Shores, 7-5, 6-3. Miss Burkhart defeated Jean Blievernicht of Southfield, 6-2, 6-3, in the semifinals. Miss Mascarin beat Marlene Swift of Sylvania, Ohio, 7-4, 6-2.

The first and second place money was donated so that the participants wouldn't lose their amateur status.
