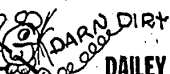

Unless there is a wild scoring spree over the coming weekend that would shuffle the standings, the Detroit area women bowlers will win a majority of the titles in the state tournament that closes Sunday.
Heading the list will be the Pine Tree Lounge team that rolled 2800 last April, and it has withstood all challenges to date. This team includes Rose Abrahamson, Susan Sternell, Jean Roth, Kay Coppola and Bonnie Barnes.

Kathy Springs is almost assured of the singles title as her 6th rolled on April 6 is one of the highest series of the year. The team with Mary Mohacci, the Livonia school teacher and Patricia Roth, of Novi, who are at the head of the doubles teams with 1240 that was rolled on April 8.
The only title that would escape them is the all-events, now held by Helen Munnich of Kalamazoo with 1833.

IT'S DIFFICULT to keep the old liners down. This was proven again with the announcement of the all-city women's teams chosen by the Detroit Women's Bowling Association.

While the younger bowlers captured most of the places on the first team, Mary Michael and Ann Sedock of Garden Lakes, both former bowling queens were named to the second team along with Elvira Toepfer, another former queen.
The first team has Cora Field, the 1975 queen as captain with Lavinia Brown, Pat Lisowski, Kathy Springs and Geraldine Beattie as teammates.
Cora dominated the women's scene all year and captured four of the top honors at the annual awards dinner. She shared in the city team title; won the all events, was named to the all-city team and then was crowned "queen."

HERE'S A NAME to remember when you are discussing the women stars of the future.
Geraldine Beattie served notice that she is on her way when she captured the women's city singles championship with a 630 series that included a 276 game.

BOB CHAMBERLAIN, who does a lot of bowling at Westland Bowl, quit being a bridesmaid in the Michigan Majors Association over the past weekend when he paced the field in the monthly event at Wildwood Lanes in Southgate. He had placed second on six occasions. This time, however, he averaged 211 in winning nine of his 12 matches and contributed a 238 game.

AT THE HALF-WAY point in the Best Ball Tournament at Merril-Bowl, Chuck Evans and Kathy Ikly are pacing the field with an 841 series. Their closest rivals are Ken Nikkila and Ralph Bingley with 1817.

LARRY BLAIR walked off with scoring honors in the Cadillac Mixed League at Garden Lanes when he posted a 236 in 670. This best Ted Stefanski by six pins while a third place went to John King with a 216 in 596. Other high scores among the men were a 246 by Rick Schultz and a 247 by Dorian Krager.

Dot Nagy showed the way to the women with a 212 in 525 and Fran Tuttle posted a 203 in 643.

Track losers may get break from state

Racetrack winners may soon be able to deduct their losses against winnings on their Michigan income tax returns.
State Representative Robert Geake (R-Northville-Livonia) has introduced a bill, House Bill 5203, which would allow winning bettors to do this.
"I want to see this bill become law because I think it's only fair to the bettor," Geake said. "As the law is now, a bettor could lose \$10,000 one race, lose it in the next and still be required to pay state income taxes on the \$10,000."
Geake, who has two racetracks in

his district, Northville Downs and Detroit Race Course, said that the federal government already allows for income tax deductions against winnings.
A Romulus High School teacher has contacted Geake about the situation. Dr. Harry Williams originally brought the inequity of the present law to Geake's attention. Williams is an avid racetrack bettor and is waging a campaign on behalf of all racing fans to be allowed to deduct losses against winnings. Williams tried unsuccessfully two years ago to file his state income tax with his losses deducted.
