•Menus of hot dogs, corn on the cob, baked beans and fresh green salads.

•Cool, alcoholic or non, fruit 'n' iced drinks.

•A table set appealingly, on patio furniture.

These were some of the pleasures shown at a Summer Living Open House recently at Jacobson's Store for the Home in Birmingham. At a two-hour session, shoppers browsed among free demonstrations, displays and modeling.

Photographer's model Jutta Schreddy, who has gotten into gourmet cooking taking classes by Cheryl Sack, prepared summer salads.

She made Nicoise salad, from the south of France, with tuna, tiny new potatoes, blanched string beans, hard-boiled eggs and sliced tomatoes. Another salad combined cold poached chicken with homemade mayonnaise and white seedless grapes.

Hot spinach salad was topped with

a hot oil dressing that blended bits of bacon and hard-boiled egg. A marinade salad combined vegetables marinated in vinegar dressing. Tiny Belgian carrots, cold white asparagus, French cut green beans and cauliflower. A conventional summer tossed salad also was demonstrated.

PAMELA SCHARFFER whipped up the fresh fruit drinks with crushed ice. Fresh pineapple, berries, lemon, lime and orange were combined with white wine and/or soda, like a spritzer.

Homemade ice cream, turned out rice and creamy in an ice-cream machine, was sampled in flavors of chocolate mint, lemon sherbert and fresh fruit.

For summer menus of hot foods, there was cookware steaming corn on the cob, a crockpot slow-cooking baked beans and a broiler-oven heating hot dogs served with barbecue sauces.

Models showed patio and at-home clothes including Ann Fogarty's gingham-wrapped apron dress and Bessie Cashin's caftan light matte jersey. Lingerie, sportswear and designers' fashions offered cool things for summer lots of cottons and floral prints.

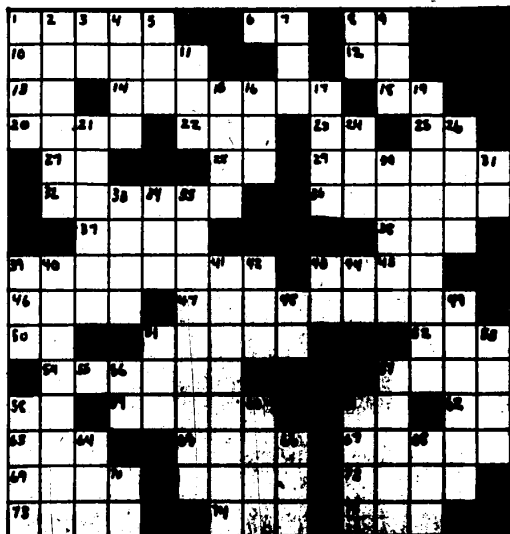
Wrought iron outdoor furniture featured table settings for dining al fresco. Games to play included badminton, tether ball and volley ball.
