

Farmington Legion '9' splits final twin bill

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Farmington ended its 18th District American Legion baseball season by splitting a doubleheader with Walled Lake last Sunday. Farmington won the first game, 7-0, and then dropped the nightcap, 9-4.

In the first game, Farmington right-hander Bob McKenna allowed just two hits, both singles, while striking out six and walking one. The victory lifted McKenna's pitching record to 5-2 this season.

Farmington put the game out of reach by scoring four runs in the first inning. Paul Rogind walked, Jim Seitz singled, Mitch Thomas tried to sacrifice and was safe on an error to load the bases. Jay Cummings then grounded out, scoring one run, and Randy Meier smacked a three-run homer to give Farmington a 4-0 lead.

The winners added another run in the third when Thomas singled and scored on Cummings' base hit. Farmington scored two more runs in the

seventh. Rogind was safe on an error, stole second, took third on another error and scored on Cummings' single. Seitz singled and rounded the bases to score when the Walled Lake shortstop booted a ground ball.

In the second game, Walled Lake's John McIntyre scattered seven Farmington hits. Losing pitcher John Jajach worked the whole game.

Farmington shortstop Jeff Herman hit a two-run homer. Meier and Sam Pink each knocked in one run. Farmington will participate in an American Legion playoff this week. Rochester, Birmingham-Troy and Berkley complete the tournament field. The tournament winner will advance to the Zone 3 Legion tournament at Utica.

Marathon swim helps finances

Farmington Hills Kendallwood Swimming Club raised approximately \$1,800 by holding a 27-hour Swim-A-Thon July 25-26. Some 80 club swimmers aged six to 18 swam from 10 to 200 lengths of the Kendallwood pool.

A spokesman for Kendallwood said part of the money will be used to buy new pool lane markers used in competitive swimming. The rest of the money will be used to finance local swimming projects, including a Kendallwood Hall of Fame.

The fastest time for swimming 200 lengths of the pool was turned in by Jim Sheller and John Spangler, both 14. They finished 200 lengths in one hour and 23 minutes.

In a Northwest Suburban Swimming League dual meet last week, Woodside Swim Club defeated Kendallwood, 308-249. The loss ended Kendallwood's record at 3-3.

Farmington Hills Beechview Swim Club defeated Pleasant Ridge Swim Club, 335-215, last week in another Northwest Suburban Swimming League meet.

Beechview's Joie Walsh set pool and team records in the eight-and-under age group by winning the 50-meter backstroke (1:20.3) and the 25 butterfly (1:20.1).

In the girls' 11-and-12 year group, Beechview's Jaisy Mead established pool and team standards in the 50 freestyle with a time of 32.0. Ann Fisher swam the 100 individual medley in 1:17.1 for another team record.

Forest Hills-Village

Forest Hills Swimming Club stopped Village, 297-372, last week. Village swimmers shattered nine team records.

In the boys' 15-17 group, Dave Smith set records in the 50 fly (1:28.5) and the 100 individual medley (1:07.8). Scott Mansfield and Bill Dunn also set records in the same age group. Mansfield won the 50 breast in 35.5, while Dunn took the 100 free-style in :39.2.

Sue MacMillan, swimming in the girls' 11-and-12 group, finished the 50 fly in :32.7 for another Village record. Kurt Maczel set two records in the boys' nine-and-10 group. He took the 50 fly (1:41.0) and the 50 back (1:41.8), breaking his old records in both events.

Nancy MacMillan, of the seven-and-eight group, won the 25 breast in :23.1 for another record. Nancy also swam on the girls' 40-year (combined age) 100 freestyle relay which won in a record 1:04.1. The rest of the relay includes Lisa MacMillan, Pam Saunders and Sue MacMillan.

Farmington High wrestler wins national championship

Mention high school wrestling in the northern suburbs and the name Mark Churella is sure to come up.

Churella, a 1975 graduate of Farmington High School, capped an outstanding prep career by winning the state championship in the 158-pound class last March. He's headed for the University of Michigan on a wrestling scholarship next fall.

But between now and then, Churella is keeping busy with plenty of competitive wrestling this summer. His most recent accomplishment is winning the 154-pound title at the U.S. Wrestling Federation Junior Championships at the University of Iowa last weekend.

Churella defeated William Smith of New York City, 7-4, in the finals. That victory must have meant a lot to Churella, who lost to Smith, 5-4, in an earlier round.

Churella, who won 40 straight matches during his senior year at

Farmington High, received another honor when "Young Wrestler," a magazine devoted to the sport—picked him for its high school national first team in the 158-pound class. The team was picked by a poll of college coaches.

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
