LIT receives Kresge grant

The Kreage Foundation has approved a grant of \$50,000 toward the renovation of offices for the School of Engineering at the Lawrence Institute of Technology.

The lunds will be used to n dernize and increase the number of action of Engineering offices. The renovation will include air-conditioning amulallow cussolidation of the engineering of incess with the offices of the folice of the stephen R. Davis. Dean of Engineering, which has been in another campus building because of space shortage.

"We are very grateful to the Krenge Foundation," said IJT President Dr. Wayne IB. Biell. "for making possible the new office complex which will encourage more interaction between students and faculty as well as provide the facilities for counseling prospective students and parents.

"The consolidation of offices also will encourage faculty members of exchange ideas and unity the effort in the development of advanced education programs."

With more than 1.300 studiets, the School of Engineering is the largest of LIT's five schools and one of the largest in the U.S. A 10 per cent increase in enrollment is expected this fall. LI.T's total 1974-75 enrollment was 4.206 men and women.

Previously, the Krenge Foundation contributed \$25,000 toward the pur-chase of equipment for the LIT col-lege dining room.

Bug killers may be banned

Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) action may ben chlordene and heptachlor, pesticides widely used in farms and homes, leaving no effective registered replacement for consumer use.

"Chlordane is the only registered pesticide available for protection from

pesticide available for protection from vegetable wireworms and, white grubs. It is sued on spiders, agts and millipedes in the home, "say Dr. Donald Cress, Michigan State University extension entomologist.

The EPA is holding hearings to determine if the posticide causes any imminent danger to human like, During the hearings it is legal to miandate-ture, distribute, sell, buy or use ethorace according to the manufacturers instructions.

"Chlordane is also used to prevent damage to turf grass and home lawns. There is no registered replace-ment for many of its uses," he says.
